Death Takes W. Rosebush at Age 72

Word has been received in Spokane of the death of Waldo F. Rosebush, 72, in New Mexico.

Mr. Rosebush was general manager and treasurer of the Inland Empire Paper Co. of Millwood from 1921 to 1936. He had visited in Millwood on Nov. 6 and, 7, as was his annual custom, and was en route to Atlanta, Ga., by train from California when death came.

Mr. Rosebush lived in Appleton, Wis., but maintained his voting residence in Millwood. He began his career as a clerk with the Patten Fine Paper Company in Wisconsin. He left to accompany Gen. John J. Pershing on his expedition against Pancho Villa in Mexico in 1916. He served in the Army in World War I in France as a major, and remained thereafter.

He was the author of several books, the latest of which was "Frontier Steel," the story of the military weapons used in the conquest of the west. He was a noted gun collector and historian. He was a member of the board of the Eastern Washington State Historical Society.

He is survived by three nephews and a niece, Burial will be at Alfred, N.Y.
